News from Euston Estate (Matthew Hawthorne, Farm Manager) - Hi all and welcome to the November news from Euston Farms. Sadly, we are not liked by some residents of Barnham as I like to think we usually are! Some people expressed their concerns at the parish council meeting this month about the maize harvest traffic. The concerns seemed to be around the quantity of tractors and trailers using the Barnham road to get to our tip site on the side of the A134. So let me take this opportunity to explain some of our logic. The farm operates a crop rotation on all 126 fields covering 7500 acres. The idea is that generally speaking each field grows a different crop every year. Sometimes fields will grow the same crop for 2 years but this is rare. For 2021 maize harvest there was a lot of crop grown at West farm. This maize is destined for the AD plant here at Euston office. I decided to reduce the harvest traffic by making an in-field clamp which allowed 4000 tons to not see the road at the point of harvest, but be brought back to the farm as needed over the next year. Subsequently we had to bring a couple of fields through Barnham to join this clamp as we have had a bumper crop this year and ran out of room at the AD plant. Every operation we do on the farm I give great consideration to all the villages and their residents, be it hedge cutting, combining at night or sugarbeet or maize harvest. It seems though that my maize harvest plans have not been good enough. There are thousands of tons harvested on this farm every season with zero complaints or even awareness. Quantities like 80tons/ha sugarbeet, 32 tons/ha maize 55 tons /ha potatoes carrots and onions and 10/ ha cereals resulting in 61,000 tons of movement. I accept that maize seems busy but it's in a short condensed window and is as you can see not even the highest yield/ha. So to conclude, we did our best to reduce traffic, we rotate the crops around the farm so you may not see any in the near future and it's the 5th highest yield on the farm. I do apologize for any upset, but we do our best and enjoy supporting all our school, church and village activities. See you all at the farmers' market for a tractor ride on the 11th December.
