**Euston Farm Update from Matthew Hawthorne (Farm Manager)** - Autumn is all about planting next year's crops and harvesting maize. But with 75mm or 3 inches of rain since 10<sup>th</sup> September this has made this busy time fraught with problems. By now we should have virtually completed drilling our Autumn cereals, however, at the time of writing we are about 45% complete. The ideal time to have the bulk of Autumn planting happening is the first week of October and as we work our way from mid to the end of October the yield potential for 2021 starts to decrease. We have been harvesting our maize for the anaerobic digester in the farmyard, which provides energy for 3,500 homes. I want to thank you all for your patience with any increase in tractor traffic or mud on the road. When we plan our harvest operation, we pay a lot of attention to three major factors: is the crop ready, a one way system for tractors/trailers and mud on the road. Please be assured we always aim to be considerate to all in our local area. I look forward to updating you on news next month.

<u>School News from Mrs. Amy Arnold (Head teacher)</u> - I am so proud to share with you just how well all our children have adapted to the new routines and systems in school. Children are enthusiastically getting stuck into learning in their own class bubbles. We are very much missing visiting the church for our harvest celebrations this year; however, we have been creative and have devised our own bubble harvest thanks and celebrations. Vicar Karen visits each week and carries out a socially distanced collective worship with a bubble of children, we value this weekly link with our church.

We were fortunate to have a Suffolk County Council Enforcement Officer visit to observe parents collecting their children from school. He was happy with the majority of the parking and recognised what a busy road Mill Lane is with two bus stops and a school! We will continue to remind parents of the children at the school to park in a safe and respectful manner.

Our Year 5 pupils have been busy taking part in outdoor challenges working on their collaboration, problem solving and communication skills, along with increasing stamina and resilience. After carefully reading maps to identify the route of their 1.93 mile walk on Euston Farm, children worked in teams to transport logs to a specified location, ready to work collaboratively to build a fire. Their team working skills and perseverance paid off with a quick toasted marshmallow on the fire before heading back to school.

Our next school update will share with you our achievements of the Autumn Term and our socially distanced Christmas celebrations.
